WHEN IN BALI

- The traditional greeting is the "sembah salute." The palms are joined together and positioned vertically against the chest, and the words "Om Swastiastu" (a Balinese greeting) are normally said. This greeting should be used when entering a Balinese home.
- You should always remove your shoes before entering a home and even some shops will ask you to do so.
- Watch out for daily offerings canang sari placed on the streets and beaches. Don't step on them! These small trays are offered to the gods throughout the day.
- It's considered rude to point a finger at another person. If you want to call to someone using your hand, always wave your fingers downward.
